CHARLESTON REGIONAL YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP (CRYA) PATIENT CARE TECHNCIAN

1. Youth Apprentices shall be paid a progressively increasing schedule of wages for each hour spent on the job during their apprenticeship. This wage increase will be based on the acquisition of increased skills and competence to the Youth Apprentice as the training progresses.
2. The wage stated below is made a part of these Standards. At no time will the starting wage rate be less than that required by any minimum wage law which may be legally applicable.
3. To qualify for the next level the youth apprentice must have completed the approximate OJL hours, necessary competencies and related education component, as listed on the Work Process Schedule and Related Instruction Outline related to this occupation (*Attachment A.2*).
